If you want protection for your child(ren) you ALSO need JDF 404 - Affidavit Regarding Children.	
Information about yourself	
 Know your current legal name, birthdate, address and phone numbers, and email address. Get the names and addresses for your work, child(ren)'s school(s), daycare, and any other locations you want protected. Find out the county in which you work or live. If you have an attorney, you need the attorney's name. If you have a current protection order against you, you must tell the court. Find the date that a protection order was issued, the case number, and name and state of the court that issued it. 	
_ Information about the person you are filing against	
 Know the full name and any aliases for each person you are filing against. Gather as much information as possible about their address, phone number(s), age or birthdate, their height, weight, hair and eye color, any scars, tattoos, etc. If there are protection orders currently in effect against them, you must tell the court. Find the date that any protection order was issued, the case number, and the name and state of the court that issued it. If you know the other person has an attorney, give the attorney's name. 	
Information about your child(ren)	
☐ If you want the protection order for your child(ren), you need their names, birthdates and	

addresses. You also need the names, relationship, and addresses of every person the child(ren)has/have lived with in the past five years. If someone else has custody of the

	ou can also ask for lesser protections, such as allowing electronic communication, but no hysical contact. Think about what you want, and what will make you and your child(ren) safe.	
_ Review the Instructions for Filing (JDF Form 400)		
a al	lead the General Information and Common Terms sections on the first page. Understand that fee may be charged. If this is an emergency and you do not have the money, ask court staff bout forms to request a fee waiver. You may be eligible for a payment plan, or might not have pay the fee.
