


Conflict Types



Data Conflict



Caused by:

- Lack of, or different, information
- Different interpretations or access to information


Examples:

- Personal budget and vacation plans
- COVID-19 response/engagement

Resolved by:

- Agree on what information is important
- Distribute data with equity

Structural Conflict



Caused by:

- Unequal power or authority
- Patterns of destructive behavior
- External circumstances (time, space, etc.)

Examples:

Hiring processes

Resolved by:

- Restructure roles and positions
- Identify, interrupt, and change destructive patterns
- Establish equitable decision making processes

Interest Conflict



Caused by:

- Perceived or real incompatible goals, needs
- When you believe your needs will be met at the expense of others' needs

Examples:

 Perceived limited resources (job, money, etc.)

Resolved by:

- Identify and focus on everyone's underlying interests
- How can we ______?

Value Conflict



Caused by:

 Different morals/ethics/beliefs on what is important or how something should be done


Examples:

• COVID-19

Resolved by:

- It is OK to have different values/morals/etc
- Focus on goal/interest or value all share

Relationship Conflict



- Miscommunications, emotions
- Stereotypes, assumptions, stories
- Repeated destructive behavior

Examples:

• Conflict with co-worker, friend, family member

Resolved by:

- Heavily enforce ground rules
- Clarify miscommunications
- Provide space to name and validate feelings
